NEW BUSINESS:

1. 2024 Budget: Port & Harbors Director Dan Berg gave a quick introduction of the proposed 2024 budget. Director Berg went on to mention that there were important significant increase on some of the line items in the budget. The notable increases for harbor department are telecommunication, maintenance and software. It was for infrastructure and maintenance for the Port.

Director Berg reiterated a major concern to get the items in the right place such that the budget reflected the cost to operate each department.

2. 2024 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Projects: Director Berg presented the 2024 Capital Improvements Plan projects and explained each line item. Projects of most importance are Bar Harbor North dredging and concrete rehabilitation, cathodic protection and piling replacement for the harbor. Consequence projects for Port includes Berth I & II corrosion evaluation, Berth III above corrosion evaluation, Berth I mooring dolphin cable replacement and Berth IV Yokohama replacements. A new maintenance shop was also on the CIP project list. Director Berg noted that the current maintenance building is deteriorated, in a generally bad condition and does not meet OSHA standards. He mentioned that there are many infrastructure projects planned that would enhance, maintain and improve the Ketchikan Port & Harbors.

Discussion was held. Chairman Flora commented that the Port needs a massive grant to support all these projects. He recommended to include pictures with the proposed 2024 Port & Harbors CIP projects. Chairman Flora mentioned that he will visit the Harbor office.
