On March 17th, 2022, the Ketchikan Police Department in conjunction with the Southeast Alaska Cities Against Drugs Taskforce (SEACAD) conducted an investigation into the importation and distribution of methamphetamine in Ketchikan.

28-year-old Ketchikan resident Daniel Kenyon and 25-year-old Ketchikan resident Glenda Johnson were contacted regarding the investigation and found to be involved in the importation and distribution of methamphetamine in the Ketchikan area. Seized in connection with the investigation was approximately 73 grams of crystal methamphetamine, drug paraphernalia and \$6,557 in cash. The estimated street value in Ketchikan of the seized methamphetamine is \$14,600.00.

On April 14th, 2022, Daniel Kenyon and Glenda Johnson were indicted by a Ketchikan Grand Jury each on one count of Misconduct Involving Controlled Substances in the Third Degree, a class B Felony. Following indictment, arrest warrants were issued for both Mr. Kenyon and Ms. Johnsons. On April 15th, 2022 they were arrested by the Ketchikan Police Department, and each held at the Ketchikan Correctional Center on \$2,500.00 bail.

SEACAD is a regional taskforce comprised of state, local and federal law enforcement agencies. SEACAD members from, the Ketchikan Police Department, Alaska State Troopers, Juneau Police Department, United States Postal Inspection Service, and the Drug Enforcement Administration partnered in this Investigation. Together, they work to investigate drug importation and distribution in the Southeast Alaska region.

All factual allegations contained in this release are based upon preliminary investigation and are subject to change or clarification as the investigation continues. Any charges reported in this release are merely accusations and all persons named in this release are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.
